Economic Development Committee Meeting Sept 22nd 2016 @ city hall

In attendance were: Diane Bryant, Judy Horne, Patsy Pike, Melissa McCarvell, Mike Willard, Ernie Penn.

Our speaker was Mark Kinion, who is currently on the Fayetteville City Council. Mark is on the water/ sewer committee and has a wealth of experience in business and with pharmaceutical companies.

The area of West Fork was recently added to the Fayetteville sewer system. It will cost about 5,000,000 for them to connect to the Fayetteville sewer system. They were able to obtain some grant money to pay for part of the project.

Fayetteville could accept Farmington into their system. Melissa McCarvell said that Farmington bought 20,000 taps from Fayetteville several years ago. To date, less than 2,000 have been used.

To bring the sewer line from the high school or Folsom elementary to the Valley View Sewer system it would probably be a distance of 12,000 feet. The current pipe may be too small to handle the additional load. Also it would require a lift station, which would cost about 1.5 million. In looking at future expansion of sewers to the southern and western boundaries of Farmington, the committee feels the system should be inclusive of many areas of our city.

Our future needs might include industrial sewer capacity. Industrial plants have expensive sewer operations, expensive to build and expensive to maintain. In planning for future sewer needs it would be wise to include some industrial components in our system.

Currently the county has 12 water stations similar to Valley View, all seem to have problems.

The new director of the Fayetteville water and sewer department is Tim Nyander.

The challenge with bringing sewer lines to the southern & western parts of our city will be the expense. Where will the money come from and who will pay for the project. Much work and investigation will need to be explored before this project is operational. We will need support from community leaders and the community as a whole.

Our next meeting will be October 27th at noon. Our speakers will be from Start Up Junkies

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-06

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A TAX ON THE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS, FOR THE YEAR 2017 FIXING THE RATE THEREOF AT 5.0 MILS AND CERTIFYING THE SAME TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to collect taxes on both real and personal property in order to provide service to the citizens of the City of Farmington, and the State law of the City of Farmington is allowed to do so:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS:

Section 1: That a tax is hereby levied on the real and personal property within the City of Farmington, Arkansas for the year 2017, to be collected in 2018, for the following purposes at the following rates:

REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY

Purpose	Levy
General Fund	5.0 Mils

Section 2: That the real and personal property tax so levied and the rate provided therefore are hereby certified to the Clerk of Washington County, Arkansas, to be placed in the tax book by the County Clerk and collected in the same manner that the county and school district taxes are collected.

Section 3: That the City Clerk is authorized and directed to file certified copies of the Ordinance in the Office of the County Recorder, County Clerk, County Assessor and the County Tax Collector for Washington County, Arkansas.

<u>Section 4</u>: Repealing Clause. All other Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5: Severability Clause. In the event any portion of the Ordinance is declared inoperative or invalid as a result of a statue or judicial decision, then only that portion

expressly so declared to be inoperative or invalid shall be affected thereby and all other provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6: Emergency Clause. That the City Council of the City of Farmington, Arkansas, further determines that this Ordinance is necessary to adequately and properly protect the inhabitants of the City; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Planning Commission Minutes August 22, 2016

1. ROLL CALL – Meeting was called to order by Chairman Robert Mann. A quorum was present.

2. Approval of Minutes: July 25, 2016 minutes were approved with one correction; Toni Bahn was absent.

3. Comments from Citizens: Developer Keith Marrs was present to ask for direction regarding seven lots he wishes to rezone from Commercial to Residential in the Twin Falls subdivision. After discussion, it was determined that he does need to come back with rezoning proposal and also can come before the Tech Plat Review Committee at the September 20, 2016 meeting.

4.A. Large Scale Development – Broyles St. Storage Phase II, 267 Broyles

Jorge Duquesne of Blew & Associates was present. There was no one present for public comment. Chris Brackett, City Engineer, presented a memo with one condition:

"1. After a final review set of plans and drainage report has been approved by MWY, the applicant should submit to the City three (3) sets of full size plans, one (1) set of half size plans and two (2) copies of the final drainage report that have been sealed by the engineer for final approval and distribution."

It was determined that this Phase II will be paved, since they are going to build more units. A reminder of landscaping was made that there should be no fast-growing, tall trees planted beneath power lines. Also, since the north edge of property is adjacent to residential zoning, possible quick growing, hardy, quite inexpensive vegetation was discussed.

Chairman Mann called for question to approve the Large Scale Development for Broyles Street Storage Phase II, contingent upon City Engineer's conditions being met. Passed unanimously.

5. Request by Rausch Coleman for Rezoning on Fayetteville Property Adjacent to Farmington

A state law requires the review and approval by a city affected by another city's rezoning adjacent property, as a courtesy. The request is first reviewed by Planning Commission and then is forwarded to City Council.

No Rausch Coleman representative was present to discuss the request for land in the City of Fayetteville, located north of W. Colfax Loop and east of Williams Elementary School. They have requested to rezone from R-PZD (Residential Planned Zoning District) to RSF-8 Residential Single Family (8 units per acre) and R-A Residential Agricultural.

After review and discussion, Chairman Mann called for question with all present voting to recommend approval of the Rausch Coleman zoning proposal and to forward it to the Farmington City Council for their consideration at their next regularly scheduled meeting.

5. Adjournment: Having no further business, Gerry Harris moved to adjourn, seconded by Sean Schader and passed unanimously.
