Minutes of the Regular Farmington City Council Meeting January 11th, 2021

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, a state of emergency was declared by Arkansas Governor Asa Hutchinson, in order to comply to social distancing requirements this meeting was held virtually using the Zoom Meeting system. Mayor Penn, City Clerk Penn, City Business Manager McCarville, Police Chief Hubbard, Fire Chief Hellard, Public Works Director Floyd Shelly and Code Enforcement Officer Rick Brammall were physically at City Hall. Police Chief Hubbard took everyone's temperature before they entered the meeting and social distancing was observed. We had no citizens come to city hall to attend the meeting. The regular meeting of the City Council scheduled for Monday, January 11th, 2021 was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Council Members answered to their names via Zoom: Sherry Mathews, Hunter Carnahan, Keith Lipford, Linda Bell, Brenda Cunningham, Bobby Morgan, Diane Bryant and Shelly Parsley. City Attorney Tennant attended via Zoom also. Mayor Penn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Comments from Citizens - None.

Approval of the minutes for the December 14th, 2020 Regular City Council Meeting. On the motion of Council Member Bryant and a second by Council Member Parsley and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 8-0.

Financial Reports - Financials were presented by Mayor Penn.

Entertain a motion to read all Ordinances and Resolutions by title only. On the motion of Council Member Cunningham and a second by Council Member Mathews and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to read all Ordinances and Resolutions by title only was approved 8-0.

Proclamations, Special Announcements, Committee/Commission Appointments. Committee Reports - Mayor Penn announced he would like to reappoint Bobby Morgan as Vice Mayor for 2021 if there were no objections, there were none. By a roll call vote and by the consent of all council members present, it was approved 8-0. Mayor Penn advised that the council would be meeting via zoom until further notice for 2021 due to the increase in Covid-19 cases. Mayor Penn advised that Superintendent John Lafoon had asked him to read a proclamation declaring January 2021 Arkansas School Board Recognition Month, Mayor Penn then read the proclamation.

Committee Reports – All committee reports were included in the council packets if they met. Council Member Bryant will have a zoom meeting for her Economic Development the third Thursday of the month.

On the motion of Council Member Bryant and a second by Council Member Parsley and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, Resolution No. 2021-01 was approved 8-0. City Clerk Penn read Resolution 2021-01.

Ordinance No. 2021-01 An ordinance waiving requirements of competitive bidding for the purchase of two (2) new Dodge Chargers with the equipment to outfit both vehicles for the Farmington Police Department pursuant to ACA Code Ann. 14-58-33 (b)(2)(b)

Chief Hubbard gave the council a brief overview of the ordinance. Council Member Carnahan made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on 3 different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2021-01 be read 1 time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Parsley and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. Council Member Bryant made a motion to approve an Emergency Clause for Ordinance 2021-01, it was seconded by Council Member Carnahan, after a roll call vote, it was approved by all those present 8-0.

Mr. Ramsfield thanked the city for the opportunity to be on the call and said he purchased the property back behind his home so it would remain a wooded area. City Clerk Penn read the resolution by title only and informed the council that the public hearing would be conducted at 6:00 p.m., before the council meeting next month, once the public hearing was closed then the council meeting would open.

There being no further business to come before the council and on the motion of Council Member Morgan and seconded by Council Member Cunningham and by the consent of all members present, the meeting adjourned at 6:25 pm until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held Monday February 8th, 2021 in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, located at 354 West Main Street, Farmington, Arkansas.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-03

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE AMENDED BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS FOR THE 12 MONTHS BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2020 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2020; APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR EACH ITEM, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Whereas, it is necessary to amend the budget to reflect actual revenues and expenditures at year end;

Now therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Farmington, Arkansas:

Section 1: This resolution shall be known as the budget amendment resolution for the City of Farmington for the twelve (12) month period beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020. The attached budget amendment is incorporated herein as if set out word for word and figure for figure to reflect actual revenues and expenditures as set forth on the succeeding pages described in Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

The Actual Income received exceeded our budgeted income by \$616,726.76

Total income for the year was \$5,220,726.76 vs. Total Expenses of \$5,081,435.15 for a surplus carryover of \$139,291.61

The City of Farmington was able to pay for the PD expansion and furniture (\$646,021.70), and our \$150,000 commitment to the library expansion remodel and purchase the house at 11155 Rosebay (\$275,000) for the Meadowsweet drainage project from our income **WITHOUT** having to use any of our reserve funds.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2021-02

AN ORDINANCE ABANDONING AND VACATING A RIGHT OF WAY THIRTY FEET IN WIDTH ADJACENT TO LOTS 13 THROUGH 19 IN THE HAMBLENS SUBDIVISION IN THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

The City Council of the City of Arkansas, Arkansas, meeting in regular session, makes the following findings of fact and enacts the following provisions:

WHEREAS, the Hamblens Subdivision was accepted by the Farmington City Council on May 13, 1969, and a 30' Right of Way was dedicated to the city on June 3, 1969, and

WHEREAS, Lots 13 through 19 in the subdivision have never been developed with residential structures and the 30' Right of Way abutting the lots has never been constructed to city standards as a paved throughfare and has never been utilized by the public as a throughfare, and

WHEREAS, Daniel Ramsfield and Donna Ramsfield, husband and wife, as the owners of 64 N. St. John Place, Lot 12 of the Grand Oaks Subdivision to the City of Farmington, whose property abuts a portion of the platted 30-foot Right of Way, purchased Lots 13 through 19 in the Hamblens Subdivision and requested the city to vacate the Right of Way, and

WHEREAS, a resolution was passed and approved by the Farmington City Council on January 11, 2021 setting a public hearing to discuss the vacation of the Right of Way, and

WHEREAS, Shane O. Miller and Jeanine A. Miller, husband and wife, as the owners of 43 N. Ridge Drive, Lot 6 of the Magnolia Ridge Subdivision to the City of Farmington, whose property abuts a portion of the platted 30-foot Right of Way, subsequently purchased Lots 13, 14 and 15 from Daniel Ramsfield and Donna Ramsfield, and

WHEREAS, the 30' Right of Way has never been used by the public and is not required for the city's corporate purposes in order to provide for the public welfare, safety, comfort, or convenience of its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, after due notice of the public hearing as required by law, the Farmington City Council heard all persons desiring to be heard on the question and has ascertained that the Right of Way dedicated to the public and sought to be vacated and abandoned is not required for the city's corporate purposes in order to provide for the public welfare, safety, comfort, or convenience of its inhabitants.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Farmington,

Arkansas:

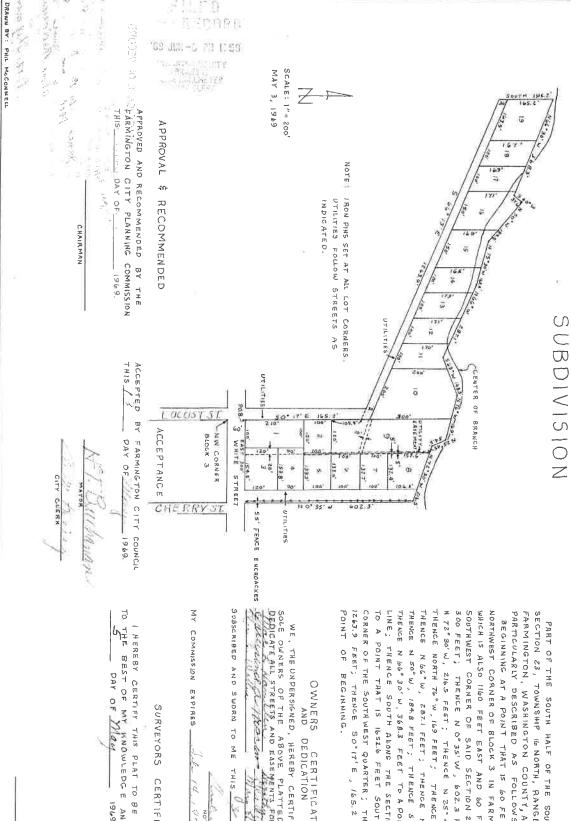
Section 1. That the City of Farmington, Arkansas, under Arkansas Code Annotated §14-54-104(2), hereby releases, vacates, and abandons all of its rights, together with the rights of the public generally, in and to those portions of the 30' Right of Way in the Hamblens Subdivision, and more specifically the portion that abuts Lots 13, 14 and 15, which have been purchased by Shane O. Miller and Jeanine A. Miller and Lots 16, 17, 18 and 19, which have been purchased by Daniel Ramsfield and Donna Ramsfield, and that the same is hereby, abandoned and vacated as dedicated streets, roads, or alleyways and that fee simple title to the Right of Way dedicated and adjacent to Lots 13, 14 and 15 are hereby vested, assigned, and granted to Shane O. Miller and Jeanine A. Miller, husband and wife, and that fee simple title to the Right of Way dedicated and adjacent to Lots 16, 17, 18 and 19 are hereby vested, assigned, and granted to Daniel Ramsfield and Donna Ramsfield, husband and wife.

Section 2. That a copy of this ordinance, duly certified by the City Clerk of the City of Farmington, Arkansas, shall be recorded in the office of the Circuit Clerk and Ex-Officio Recorder of Washington County, Arkansas.

Section 3. Emergency Clause. That the City Council of the City of Farmington further determines that it is not necessary to delay the enactment of this ordinance for further review; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared, and this ordinance shall be in full force an effect from and after its passage and approval.

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of this proposal.

Background

In our landscape ordinance, developers are required to donate park land, or pay money in lieu of donating land. The question has come up as to whether we want land or would prefer the funds. In some cases the question has become about the particular land being donated and the proximity to existing park property.

Discussion

The Planning Commission would like to have some direction with regard to location of parks and how much park property is appropriate. The end result of this proposal is direction for staff and planning commission regarding parkland dedication requirements while bettering Farmington's community and its citizens' lives. The plan will consist of the following steps:

PHASE 1: Project Kick-Off & Inventory

PHASE 2: Masterplan

PHASE 3: Studies (sub-contracted; by others)

PHASE 4: Ordinance Update
PHASE 5: Parks Plan Document

Budget Impact

We have budgeted \$25,000 in the park budget for engineering fees. Total lump sum- all phases \$ 24,900.00.

SHORT FORM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND ENGINEER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT effective as of December 21, 2020 ("Effective Date") between the **City of Farmington** ("Owner") and **EARTHPLAN DESIGN ALTERNATIVES** ("Engineer").

Owner's Project, of which Engineer's services under this Agreement are a part, is generally identified as follows: Farmington Park Masterplan ("Project") (EDA Job #2284).

Engineer's services under this Agreement are generally identified as follows:

Project Scope:

As we work with the City about to provide the desired outcome and process, the below steps and desired outcome can be adjusted. Some areas may be wished to be expanded upon while some areas may be requested to be minimal. We can work within any budget constraints you identify; however, the end product will vary depending on the budget and hour constraints. We are committed to providing you with a quality product that fits the City's budget while also providing an excellent park plan for Farmington. We invite further conversation on this process. The end result of an excellent park plan that will direct staff's parkland dedication requirements while bettering Farmington's community and its citizens' lives is an exciting opportunity. We greatly appreciate the consideration for this role!

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

At the November 16, 2020 Planning Commission meeting, the Planning Commissioners requested a scope of work letter to describe the work involved in a proposed Park Masterplan. EDA provided that letter on December 3, 2020 and on December 11, 2020 a formal proposal based on that scope of work letter was provided. Below is an explanation of the involved work:

II. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

In general, the scope of services shall include a new park design for the City of Farmington, AR as follows:

PHASE 1: **Project Kick-Off & Inventory**

PHASE 2: Masterplan

PHASE 3: **Studies** (sub-contracted; by others)

PHASE 4: Ordinance Update
PHASE 5: Parks Plan Document

More specifically, the services to be provided shall meet the following guidelines:

Phase 1: Project Kick-off & Inventory

Task 1: Goals and Objectives

(Deliverable: Vision Statement and Goals and Objectives will be developed after discussions with City staff; these elements will guide the trajectory of the park plan to meet the City's needs)

Develop a Preliminary Vision with stated Goals and Objectives

Task 2: Inventory Map

(Deliverable: Collected data will influence the Research and Analysis Phase (Phase 2) and will form the base layer of the Parks Map.)

- Identify the existing parks' amenities and the *park classifications* of those parks (both within the City limits and surrounding regional recreational areas)
- Identify the City's existing public park connections with elements such as: city trails, bike lanes, potential adjoining city trail connections, existing park and school locations, public buildings, greenspaces, areas with higher population density, Northwest Arkansas Open Space Plan. All elements will be considered as a whole to guide determinations for where parks are needed.
- Inventory will also include the following data:
 - o Future Land Use Map
 - Zoning Map
 - o Road network
 - Latest available aerial imagery
 - Parcel boundaries
 - Waterways and floodplains. Locations of springs and water recharge areas, important archeological areas, ecologically sensitive sites.
 - "landscape character areas"
 - Contour data
 - Water and sewer data where readily available

Total Sum PHASE 1......\$ 4,640.00

Phase 2: Masterplan

Task 1: Research & Analysis

(Deliverable: The data collected during Phase 1 and through the Community engagement will be analyzed to guide the general areas where parks will be recommended. Ideas will be developed to guide how the City addresses the locations of, numbers of, and needed types of future parks.)

- Community engagement: determine through a community survey and through reaching out to youth and adult programs in Farmington what the community desires and needs from future parks.
- Determine what types of parks are lacking and where they are needed.
- Develop a plan to promote realistic walkability of the citizens to the parks (a 5 or 10 minute walk plan perhaps).
- Determine the types of parks that may be lacking and where their ideal placements might be.
- Identify ways to encourage low maintenance parks (use of native plants and natural play designs)
- Plan for how to guide preservation of important and special properties while preserving landscape character of specific areas of Farmington.
- Study the City's demographics and population density patterns (current and projected based off current trends and zoning) and the impacts they could have on the City's park needs (more playlots for preschool ages? Equipment for older citizens? Skate parks? Etc.)

- Study the City's Future Land Use Plan and Zoning Maps to determine areas where parks will be needed in the future.
- Identify if the existing parks could be easily expanded upon in any manner to provide additional services.

Task 2: Parks Plan

(Deliverable: A parks masterplan map will be created in GIS; this map will show areas recommended for parks based on the data gathered through inventory, research, and analysis.)

- GIS map with the latest-available data (roads, floodplain, etc.). The City will receive a printed and digital
 map that will provide guidance to the City for development requirements regarding parkland
 acquisition.
- The map will reflect a park plan reflecting the gathered data's information and showing the areas identified as being needed and ideal for future parks.
- Once adopted by the City Council, this map will be able to be utilized to help secure City funding for
 parks. It will also provide a guide to the City showing what lands the City will accept as parkland versus
 when fee in lieu of may be the best option.
- Meetings as needed with staff.

Phase 3: Studies (sub-contracted; by others)

(At one point at the Planning Commission meeting, the members discussed wanting to know the operating cost of the current parks. A study could be outsourced to provide this but the City might be better served by City Staff who likely have quick access to the needed numbers. However, interest in having a funding study done was also discussed.)

<u>Funding Plan:</u> consider feasibility of Hotel/Motel/Restaurant (HMR) taxes, any other potential funding sources such as other taxes/fees/grants, and the current fee in lieu of rate stated in Ordinance 2016-01. (this might be a full plan or perhaps just a series of conversations with someone with experience helping City with these matters (the work could be tailored to meet the City's desires), conversations with city staff that handle taxes, etc., and/or a conversation with Mr. Tennant regarding his experiences and knowledge on these matters.

Total Sum PHASE 3.....if desired, we can contact an outside firm offering these services for a proposal. Please advise.

Phase 4: Ordinance Update

(Deliverable: provide updated ordinance language)

- Line by line review and update of the park portion of Landscape Ordinance 2016-01 [Review and update of the landscape portion of the code, if requested, can be provided but is not being considered in this Scope of Work Letter).
- Meetings as needed with Staff.

Phase 5: Parks Plan Document

(Deliverable: this document will explain the Parks Plan process, will provide an implementation plan, and will act as guidance for the City in addressing the locations of, numbers of, and needed types of future parks.

- Compilation of researched data acquired during Park Plan Process. Provides the data, the findings of the data analysis, and our recommendations.
- Meetings as needed with Staff.
- Provide an Implementation Plan for a time frame such as 10 years:
 - o Action plan
 - Phasing Plan: prioritized list of projects and actions which will be broken down into short-term/medium-term/long-term phases

- A. All public notifications for meetings.
- B. City's legal counsel as needed for consultation regarding the code change implementation process in addition to review of any legislation change advice (to be billed separately through the City's contract with Mr. Tennant).

CHANGES IN SCOPE OF SERVICES:

- 1. Any change in what's desired of the park plan process different from what is outlined in this letter will result in additional fees to the owner.
- 2. Any service deleted from this proposal by the Owner will become the responsibility of the Owner.

Owner and Engineer further agree as follows:

1.01 Basic Agreement

A. Engineer shall provide or furnish the Services set forth in this Agreement. If authorized by Owner, or if required because of changes in the Project, Engineer shall furnish services in addition to those set forth above ("Additional Services"); prices for said additional services will be in addition to the Estimated Total Salary Cost Sum breakdown.

2.01 Payment Procedures

- A. *Invoices:* Engineer shall prepare invoices in accordance with its standard invoicing practices and submit the invoices to Owner on a monthly basis. Invoices are due and payable within 30 days of receipt. If Owner fails to make any payment due Engineer for Services, Additional Services, and expenses within 30 days after receipt of Engineer's invoice, then (1) the amounts due Engineer will be increased at the rate of 1.0% per month (or the maximum rate of interest permitted by law, if less) from said thirtieth day, and (2) in addition Engineer may, after giving seven days written notice to Owner, suspend Services under this Agreement until Engineer has been paid in full all amounts due for Services, Additional Services, expenses, and other related charges. Owner waives any and all claims against Engineer for any such suspension.
- B. Payment: As compensation for Engineer providing or furnishing Services and Additional Services, Owner shall pay Engineer as set forth in Paragraphs 2.01, 2.02 (Services), and 2.03 (Additional Services). If Owner disputes an invoice, either as to amount or entitlement, then Owner shall promptly advise Engineer in writing of the specific basis for doing so, may withhold only that portion so disputed, and must pay the undisputed portion.

2.02 Basis of Payment—Hourly Rates Plus Reimbursable Expenses

- A. Owner shall pay Engineer for Services as follows:
 - An amount equal to the cumulative hours charged to the Project by each class of Engineer's employees times standard hourly rates for each applicable billing class, plus reimbursement of expenses incurred in connection with providing the Services and Engineer's consultants' charges, if any.
 - 2. Engineer's Standard Hourly Rates are attached as Appendix 1 & Appendix 2.
 - 3. The total compensation for Services and reimbursable expenses is \$24,900.00.
- 2.03 Additional Services: For Additional Services, Owner shall pay Engineer an amount equal to the cumulative hours charged in providing the Additional Services by each class of Engineer's employees, times standard hourly rates for each applicable billing class; plus reimbursement of expenses incurred in connection with providing the Additional Services and Engineer's consultants' charges, if any. Engineer's standard hourly rates are attached as Appendix 1.

3.01 Termination

- A. The obligation to continue performance under this Agreement may be terminated:
 - 1. For cause,

- a. By either party upon 30 days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the Agreement's terms through no fault of the terminating party. Failure to pay Engineer for its services is a substantial failure to perform and a basis for termination.
- b. By Engineer:
 - 1) upon seven days written notice if Owner demands that Engineer furnish or perform services contrary to Engineer's responsibilities as a licensed professional; or
 - 2) upon seven days written notice if the Engineer's Services are delayed for more than 90 days for reasons beyond Engineer's control, or as the result of the presence at the Site of undisclosed Constituents of Concern, as set forth in Paragraph 5.01.I.
- c. Engineer shall have no liability to Owner on account of a termination for cause by Engineer.
- d. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement will not terminate as a result of a substantial failure under Paragraph 3.01.A.1.a if the party receiving such notice begins, within seven days of receipt of such notice, to correct its substantial failure to perform and proceeds diligently to cure such failure within no more than 30 days of receipt of notice; provided, however, that if and to the extent such substantial failure cannot be reasonably cured within such 30 day period, and if such party has diligently attempted to cure the same and thereafter continues diligently to cure the same, then the cure period provided for herein shall extend up to, but in no case more than, 60 days after the date of receipt of the notice.
- 2. For convenience, by Owner effective upon Engineer's receipt of written notice from Owner.
- B. In the event of any termination under Paragraph 3.01, Engineer will be entitled to invoice Owner and to receive full payment for all Services and Additional Services performed or furnished in accordance with this Agreement, plus reimbursement of expenses incurred through the effective date of termination in connection with providing the Services and Additional Services, and Engineer's consultants' charges, if any.

4.01 Successors, Assigns, and Beneficiaries

- A. Owner and Engineer are hereby bound and the successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives of Owner and Engineer (and to the extent permitted by Paragraph 4.01.B the assigns of Owner and Engineer) are hereby bound to the other party to this Agreement and to the successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, in respect of all covenants, agreements, and obligations of this Agreement.
- B. Neither Owner nor Engineer may assign, sublet, or transfer any rights under or interest (including, but without limitation, money that is due or may become due) in this Agreement without the written consent of the other party, except to the extent that any assignment, subletting, or transfer is mandated by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement.
- C. Unless expressly provided otherwise, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create, impose, or give rise to any duty owed by Owner or Engineer to any Constructor, other third-party individual or entity, or to any surety for or employee of any of them. All duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole and exclusive benefit of Owner and Engineer and not for the benefit of any other party.

5.01 General Considerations

A. The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by Engineer under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the subject profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. Engineer makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with any

- services performed or furnished by Engineer. Subject to the foregoing standard of care, Engineer and its consultants may use or rely upon design elements and information ordinarily or customarily furnished by others, including, but not limited to, specialty contractors, manufacturers, suppliers, and the publishers of technical standards.
- B. Engineer shall not at any time supervise, direct, control, or have authority over any Constructor's work, nor shall Engineer have authority over or be responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any Constructor, or the safety precautions and programs incident thereto, for security or safety at the Project site, nor for any failure of a Constructor to comply with laws and regulations applicable to such Constructor's furnishing and performing of its work. Engineer shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of any Constructor.
- C. Engineer neither guarantees the performance of any Constructor nor assumes responsibility for any Constructor's failure to furnish and perform its work.
- D. Engineer's opinions (if any) of probable construction cost are to be made on the basis of Engineer's experience, qualifications, and general familiarity with the construction industry. However, because Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment, or services furnished by others, or over contractors' methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, Engineer cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids, or actual construction cost will not vary from opinions of probable construction cost prepared by Engineer. If Owner requires greater assurance as to probable construction cost, then Owner agrees to obtain an independent cost estimate.
- E. Engineer shall not be responsible for any decision made regarding the construction contract requirements, or any application, interpretation, clarification, or modification of the construction contract documents other than those made by Engineer or its consultants.
- F. All documents prepared or furnished by Engineer are instruments of service, and Engineer retains an ownership and property interest (including the copyright and the right of reuse) in such documents, whether or not the Project is completed. Owner shall have a limited license to use the documents on the Project, extensions of the Project, and for related uses of the Owner, subject to receipt by Engineer of full payment due and owing for all Services and Additional Services relating to preparation of the documents and subject to the following limitations:
 - Owner acknowledges that such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for use on the Project unless completed by Engineer, or for use or reuse by Owner or others on extensions of the Project, on any other project, or for any other use or purpose, without written verification or adaptation by Engineer;
 - any such use or reuse, or any modification of the documents, without written verification, completion, or adaptation by Engineer, as appropriate for the specific purpose intended, will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer or to its officers, directors, members, partners, agents, employees, and consultants;
 - 3. Owner shall indemnify and hold harmless Engineer and its officers, directors, members, partners, agents, employees, and consultants from all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from any use, reuse, or modification of the documents without written verification, completion, or adaptation by Engineer; and
 - 4. such limited license to Owner shall not create any rights in third parties.
- G. Owner and Engineer may transmit, and shall accept, Project-related correspondence, documents, text, data, drawings, information, and graphics, in electronic media or digital format, either directly, or through access to a secure Project website, in accordance with a mutually agreeable protocol.
- H. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Owner and Engineer (1) waive against each other, and the other's employees, officers, directors, members, agents, insurers, partners, and consultants, any and all claims for or entitlement to special, incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of, resulting from, or in

- any way related to this Agreement or the Project, and (2) agree that Engineer's total liability to Owner under this Agreement shall be limited to \$100,000 or the total amount of compensation received by Engineer, whichever is greater.
- I. The parties acknowledge that Engineer's Services do not include any services related to unknown or undisclosed Constituents of Concern. If Engineer or any other party encounters, uncovers, or reveals an unknown or undisclosed Constituent of Concern, then Engineer may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of Services on the portion of the Project affected thereby until such portion of the Project is no longer affected, or terminate this Agreement for cause if it is not practical to continue providing Services.
- J. Owner and Engineer agree to negotiate each dispute between them in good faith during the 30 days after notice of dispute. If negotiations are unsuccessful in resolving the dispute, then the dispute shall be mediated. If mediation is unsuccessful, then the parties may exercise their rights at law.
- K. This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the state in which the Project is located.
- L. Engineer's Services and Additional Services do not include: (1) serving as a "municipal advisor" for purposes of the registration requirements of Section 975 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (2010) or the municipal advisor registration rules issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission; (2) advising Owner, or any municipal entity or other person or entity, regarding municipal financial products or the issuance of municipal securities, including advice with respect to the structure, timing, terms, or other similar matters concerning such products or issuances; (3) providing surety bonding or insurance-related advice, recommendations, counseling, or research, or enforcement of construction insurance or surety bonding requirements; or (4) providing legal advice or representation.

6.01 Total Agreement

A. This Agreement (including any expressly incorporated attachments), constitutes the entire agreement between Owner and Engineer and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

7.01 Definitions

- A. Constructor—Any person or entity (not including the Engineer, its employees, agents, representatives, and consultants), performing or supporting construction activities relating to the Project, including but not limited to contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, Owner's work forces, utility companies, construction managers, testing firms, shippers, and truckers, and the employees, agents, and representatives of any or all of them.
- B. Constituent of Concern—Asbestos, petroleum, radioactive material, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), hazardous waste, and any substance, product, waste, or other material of any nature whatsoever that is or becomes listed, regulated, or addressed pursuant to (a) the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, 42 U.S.C. §§9601 et seq. ("CERCLA"); (b) the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, 49 U.S.C. §§5101 et seq.; (c) the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. §§6901 et seq. ("RCRA"); (d) the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 U.S.C. §§2601 et seq.; (e) the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. §§1251 et seq.; (f) the Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. §§7401 et seq.; or (g) any other federal, State, or local statute, law, rule, regulation, ordinance, resolution, code, order, or decree regulating, relating to, or imposing liability or standards of conduct concerning, any hazardous, toxic, or dangerous waste, substance, or material.

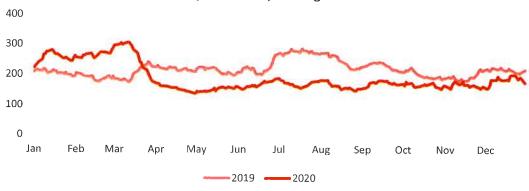


City Routes Passengers per Revenue Hour

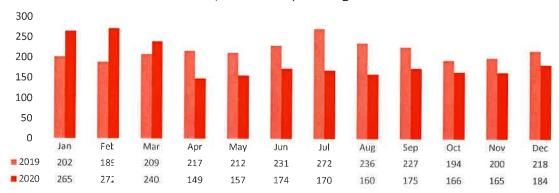

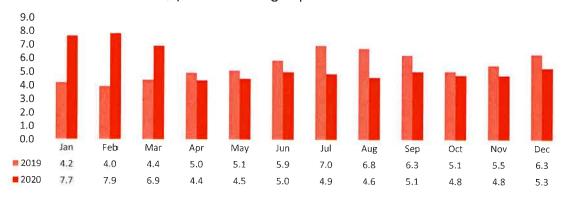

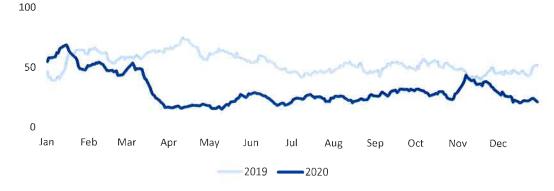


City Routes Passengers per Revenue Hour

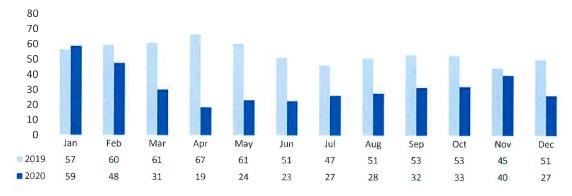

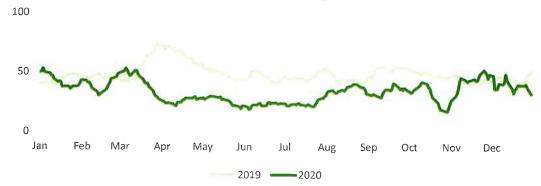

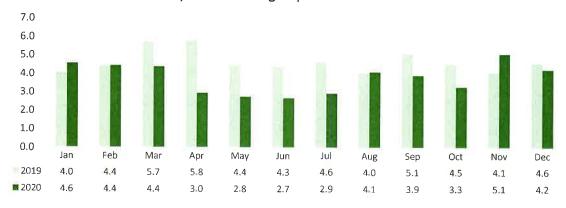
