Minutes of the Regular Farmington City Council Meeting March 14, 2016

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday March 14, 2016 was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Aldermen answered to their names: Patsy Pike, Sherry Mathews, Linda Bell, Brenda Cunningham, Bobby Morgan, Diane Bryant and Shelly Parsley. Alderman Lipford was absent. Also present were City Attorney Tennant and City Business Manager McCarville.

Mayor Penn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Comments from Citizens - None.

Approval of the minutes for the February 8, 2016 regular meeting of the city council.

On the motion of Alderman Bell and seconded by Alderman Mathews and by the consent of all members present, the minutes for the meeting were approved as presented.

Financial Reports – City Clerk Penn advised that city sales tax was \$58,889.40, up \$4,326.63, County sales tax was \$101,489.67, up \$6976.24 for a total increase of \$11,302.87.

EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

This Contract made as of the 11th day of April, 2016, between the Farmington Public School District (the "Farmington School") and the City of Farmington, Arkansas (the "City").

WHEREAS, the Farmington School desires to employ one (1) City police officer as a School Resource Officer (hereinafter "SRO") for the period and upon and subject to the terms herein provided; and

WHEREAS, the City is willing to provide a police officer for the Farmington School upon and subject to the terms herein provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, adequacy and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. Term of Employment: Compensation. The Farmington School agrees to employ one (1) City police officer for position of SRO from the date hereof as an employee through June 30, 2017. The Farmington Schools will reimburse the City for fifty percent (50%) of the total payroll cost of each SRO provided by the City, including payroll and withholding deductions as required by law and such other payroll deductions, as may be determined by the City.
- 2. <u>Position and Duties</u>. The City police officer shall fulfill the position of School Resource Officer and shall have the duties normally ascribed to those positions and as assigned to them by the Farmington School Superintendent and the Farmington Chief of Police. The SRO shall devote substantially all time, labor, skill, undivided attention and his or her best abilities to the performance of prescribed duties hereunder in a manner which will faithfully and diligently further the interests of the Farmington School and its student body.

3. Policy and Procedures

It is further understood and agreed as follows:

- a. The SRO will be under the direct supervision of the school superintendent and general supervision of the Farmington Chief of Police.
- b. Because school functions such as ball games are after school hours, it will be the responsibility of the SRO to adjust his/her work schedule so that he/she can attend the home games.
- c. No overtime pay or compensation time will be authorized without prior approval by the Farmington Chief of Police.
- d. The SRO will take his/her vacation during school Spring break, Christmas vacation, or during the Summer while school is out for Summer break unless approved by the Farmington Chief of Police.
- e. The SRO will keep the Farmington Chief of Police updated daily of any problems and/or activities involving the SRO in his/her job duties.
- f. During the school day, the SRO will be on call to backup other police officers or respond to calls if he/she is the only one presently in the City at the time of the call. The SRO will be notified if he/she is to be on call.
- g. The SRO will dress in full class A uniform, or assigned uniform by the Farmington Chief of Police. During Spring and Fall seasons the uniform may be a more relaxed look, such as shorts and golf type shirts.
- h. The Farmington Police Department will furnish a patrol vehicle for patrol of school grounds for SRO use.
- 4. Entire Agreement. This Contract contains the entire agreement between the Farmington School and the City with respect to the subject matter hereof and there have been no oral or other agreements of any kind whatsoever as a condition precedent or inducement to the signing of this Contract or otherwise concerning this Contract or the subject matter hereof.
- 5. Amendments. This Contract may not be amended, nor shall any waiver, change, modification, consent or discharge be effected except by an instrument in writing executed by or on behalf of the party against whom enforcement of any waiver, change, modification, consent or discharge is sought.
- 7. Governing Law. This Contract shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Arkansas.

Planning Commission Minutes February 22, 2016

1. ROLL CALL – Meeting was called to order by Chairman Robert Mann. A quorum was present.

- **2. Approval of Minutes:** Minutes of November 23, 2015 were unanimously approved as written.
- **3. Comments from Citizens:** Mayor Ernie Penn reported on his meeting with Larry Bowden of Briar Rose Bakery regarding building of a large open-air pavilion. He is not opposed to paved parking or landscaping (and he may ask the Farmington Garden Club for input with it.) Also, he does not want to lose the big trees on the lot. He plans to come to the Planning Commission in the future to ask for waiver of requirements for a full-scale development. The Mayor assured Mr. Bowden that the Planning Commissioners are <u>not</u> "anti-business."
- **4. Public Hearing Variance Request for Farmington High School Landscaping** Geoffrey Bates of Bates & Associates, Inc. was present to discuss the LSD for the Farmington School District's property located at 12329 N. Highway 170. They are willing to landscape, but have concerns about full landscaping in required areas where future Highway 170 construction and on-campus construction will damage or remove the landscaping.

Dr. and Mrs. Alex Lacy have lived across the street from the high school property for 35 years. He said that the Phase I which was done prior to landscaping ordinance had used a "scorched earth" method on the property, removing numerous old trees, some of which might have been saved. He pleaded with Planning Commissioners to not cut corners with the landscaping requirements because it is vitally important to the overall appearance of the high school which will be in use for many, many years. In addition, visitors will be coming to the high school from all over the state for athletic and fine arts events and it will give a favorable impression, with landscaping. He also mentioned that he has taught at five universities during his career, one of which was the University of Virginia, which is known world-wide for its beautiful, carefully planned landscaping and it made a great difference in campus when compared to some other campuses. He said it has been shown that attractive landscaping is inspirational and beneficial to students.

Judge Mike Mashburn who owns property adjoin the school property was present and also interested in what will be done with the land.

It was noted that the Planning Commission members are in the process of re-evaluating the landscape ordinance requirements and will very soon vote on the changes. The suggested revised ordinance will then be sent to the City Council for their consideration.

Mark Haguewood with High Jackson Associates expressed concern about delaying a building permit due to tabling of landscape variance.

It was moved that the Farmington High School Landscaping variance request be tabled until the landscaping ordinance has been finalized, and the construction building permit will be issued. Commissioners unanimously voted "yes".

5. Election of Officers:

Gerry Harris moved, seconded by Matt Hutcherson, to re-elect Robert Mann as Chairman. Vote was unanimous.

Sean Schader moved, seconded by Jay Moore, to re-elect Gerry Harris as Vice Chair. Vote was unanimous.

Sean Schader moved, seconded by Gerry Harris, to re-elect Judy Horne as Secretary. Vote was unanimous.

6. Landscaping Ordinance Review:

Commissioners were provided with a copy of proposed revised landscaping ordinance. Judy Horne explained some of the major revisions to the ordinance and distributed a comparison sheet for Commissioners' consideration.

7. Adjournment: Having no further business, Gerry Harris moved to adjourn, seconded by Sean Schader and passed unanimously.
