Minutes of the Regular Farmington City Council Meeting on April 8, 2013

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday, April 8, 2013 was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Aldermen answered to their names: Patsy Pike, Sherry Mathews, Keith Lipford, Janie Steele, Brenda Cunningham, Bobby Morgan and Terry Yopp. Shelly Parsley was absent. A quorum was declared (7). Also present were City Business Manager McCarville, City Attorney Tennant and Financial Office Jimmy Story. After Mayor Penn led the pledge of allegiance, he then opened the public comment portion of the meeting for citizens. Jodi Hendricks, President of the Chamber of Commerce informed the council that their banquets was going to be Tuesday April 16th and tickets were available at City Hall if they were interested in attending. Alderwoman Brenda Cunningham introduced the new Pastor of the Church of Christ, Michael Raines.

Approval of the minutes for March 11, 2013 Meeting - On the motion of Alderman Yopp and seconded by Alderman Steele and by the consent of all members present, the minutes were approved, accepted and filed as amended by the City Clerk (7/0).

Financial Reports – City sales tax was up \$4,194.01, County sales tax was up \$4,302.47 for a total increase of \$8,496.48.

<u>Section 2</u>: That the adoption of this plan means that it will serve as a guideline for developing future trails and does not imply a commitment of funding by the City.


Section 3: That the Master Trail Plan should be and is hereby adopted as the City's official guide as future





Beautify Farmington Minutes – March 14, 2013 Farmington City Hall

Meeting was called to order at 6 PM by Brenda Cunningham, Chair.

Present: Brent Vinson, Patsy Pike, Judy Horne

Cherry Tree Planting on Broyles

Brenda discussed seeing photographs of cherry trees lining a street in the December issue of *City and Town*, a publication of the Arkansas Municipal League. Brent Vinson reported that this type of fast-growing tree will reach a height of about 20 feet tall. He suggested started with planting approximately 60 smaller-sized cherry trees, 20 feet apart. When ordered it will take about 2-3 weeks to receive them and they need to be planted before June. The easy way to plant them is to utilize a tractor with an augur to make the hole. Planting the tree is then easy. Williams Tractor will be contacted to see if the equipment might be borrowed. Volunteer assistance was discussed for planting, but it was decided that it would not be a volunteer job for smaller children.

It was decided to begin first planting on Broyles Street from Main Street, north. Next the trees will be planted on Southwinds from Main Street, south.

Decorative Street Lighting Discussed

Brent Vinson, who is a licensed Landscape Architect, had made several illustrated drawings of areas of the city, including a map of the entire Highway 62 corridor showing placement of decorative street lights. Cost per light is approximately \$3,000. Cost of electrical work and street light installation is not included in the \$3,000 figure. The amount per year for beautification work is \$5,000.

After discussion, it was decided that lights installation would begin at the Yukon Way – Highway 62/ Main Street intersection and proceed west to the area where City Hall is located. Hopefully a grant can be obtained to fund 18 lights as the first stage of lighting.

Brent will work with the Arkansas State Highway Department regarding the proposed lighting plan.

Proposed Landscaping Ordinance

Judy Horne provided each member with the final Draft copy of the proposed landscaping ordinance for their review. The members of the committee expressed interest in attending the Planning Commission Work Session on Monday, March 18.

Having no further business, meeting was adjourned.
