WHEREAS, a petition was duly filed with the city council of the City of Farmington, Arkansas on the 25th day of March, 2014 asking the city council to vacate and abandon a portion of the Bonnie Lane right-of-way as platted in the Calvin Phillips Subdivision, which is described as follows, to- wit:

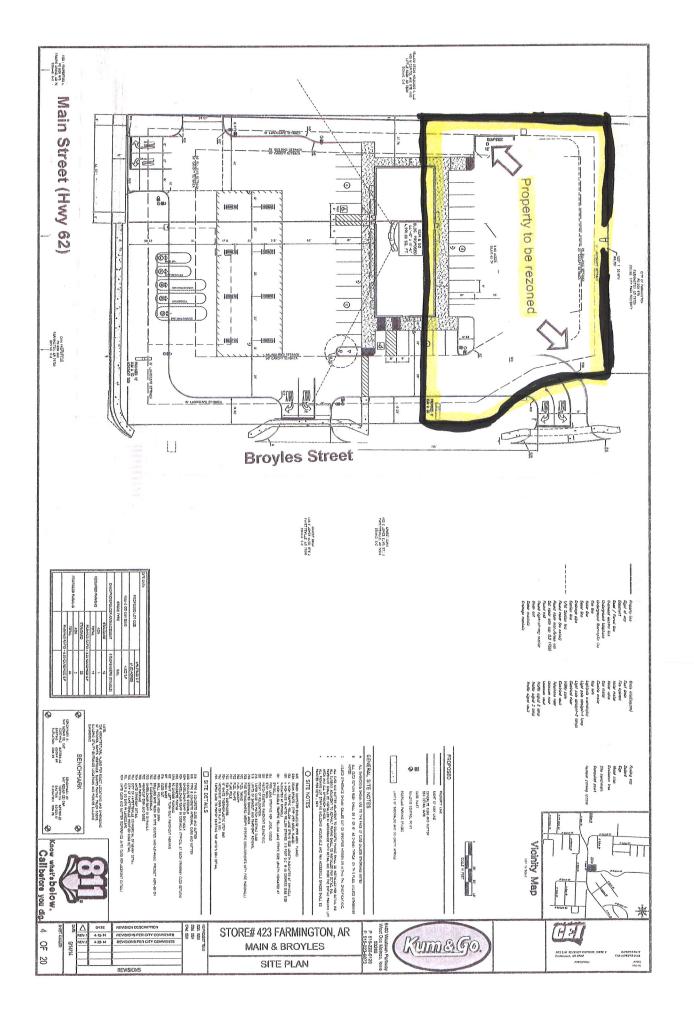

Recommendation

Requesting that AHTD do a warrant study could be beneficial.

Background

Over the past couple of years several citizens have asked about a signal at Hwy 62 and Holland Drive

Discussion

I am attaching a memo from Chad Adams who is our district engineer for AHTD that describes the process for requesting a signal on highway right of way. If we request that AHTD do a warrant study, it costs us nothing. That request goes in line with other requests in this district. I have no indication as to how long the study will take. As Mr. Adams mentions, if a signal is warranted, the actual construction would depend on availability of funds. When we were considering waiting for AHTD to pay for the signal at Broyles there was about a 4 year wait, which is why we opted to pay for that signal with City funds. Currently, I am told the wait could be 2-3 years.

Another factor to consider is that Fayetteville will be completing Rupple Road construction to Hwy 62 in early 2016. They will be requesting a signal at that intersection. This signal and the completion of Rupple Road will definitely have an effect on the intersection we are considering. Fayetteville is also considering an extension of Alberta Street to Rupple Road, this extension is dependent on availability of funds. This would also have an effect on our request.

The Large Scale Development Plan for the Kum & Go Store #423 has been reviewed and it is our opinion that the Planning Commission's approval should be conditional on the following comments.

1. Submit two (2) copies of the filed easement plat before final approval of the plans. A copy of the proposed easement plat should be submitted to MWY for review prior to filing.

2. The water and sewer improvements must be reviewed and approved by the City of Fayetteville Engineering Department and the Arkansas Department of Health

prior to any construction activities.

3. After a final review set of plans and drainage report has been approved by MWY, the applicant should submit to the City three (3) sets of full size plans and one (1) set of half size plans, and two (2) more copies of the final drainage report that have been sealed by the engineer for final approval and distribution.

4. A grading permit will be required for this development. Please see the Stormwater Pollution Prevention, Grading and Erosion Control Ordinance.

The following comments can be addressed in the construction plan submittal.

- 1. The sidewalk is to be continuous through the driveways without ramps. Please see the City of Farmington's Sidewalk Specifications Ordinance 8.1(C) on the proper grading for sidewalks. There still appears to be ramp at the northern entrance off of Broyles Street and the cross slope of the sidewalk shown for the southern entrance is not correct. Please provide more details on the construction of the entrances (spot elevations).
- 2. The existing access easement in the southwest corner of the property is currently shown as being vacated but this easement is necessary for the Dollar General Fire access.
- 3. The drainage easement in the detention pond must be shown from the tributary pipes entering the pond all the way through to the outlet. Please revise.
