### Minutes of the Regular Farmington City Council Meeting August 8, 2016

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday August 8, 2016 was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Aldermen answered to their names: Patsy Pike, Sherry Mathews, Keith Lipford, Linda Bell, Brenda Cunningham, Bobby Morgan, Diane Bryant and Shelly Parsley. Also present was City Attorney Tennant, City Business Manager McCarville absent.

Mayor Penn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Comments from Citizens** – Lelia Moore, a resident on Giles Road asked that something be done about Giles road. She advised that the road is slick when it rains and too many people are running off in the ditch.

Dr. Tim O'Neil addressed the council regarding the problem emergency vehicles could encounter on Rheas Mill Road and Double Springs Road when school starts from the back up from people picking their kids up that are waiting in line and blocking traffic. The city and the school need to get on the same page and fix the issue because the road is impassable for emergency vehicles.

### Approval of the minutes for the July 11, 2016 regular meeting of the city council.

On the motion of Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Lipford and by the consent of all members present, the minutes for the meeting were approved as presented.

**Financial Reports** – City Clerk Penn advised that city sales tax was up \$3,698.72, county sales tax was up \$5095.18 for a total increase of \$8793.90.

### Recommendation

City staff recommends approval of this resolution. The requested zoning, Neighborhood Conservation, is compatible with the surrounding area.

### Background

State law requires that we approve a re-zoning that is adjacent to our city limits.

### **Discussion**

Rausch Coleman is continuing their development of the area immediately east of our city limits. This area was previously a planned unit development, but that designation expired. Because of the expiration of the previous zoning classification Rausch Coleman had to request zoning again. The Neighborhood Conservation zone has the least activity and a lower density than the other zones. Although Neighborhood Conservation is the most purely residential zone, it can have some mix of uses, such as civic buildings. Neighborhood Conservation serves to promote and protect neighborhood character. It should also be noted that the north 4.55 acres adjacent to Goose Creek was rezoned to Agricultural, essentially creating a natural buffer along the creek. This will be in addition to 5-10 acres of tree preservation are that will also be set aside.

### **Budget Impact**



### August 2016 Monthly Report for Mayor and City Council

The Fire department responded to 75 calls during the month of August and that is still about average for the year, we have been in the seventies most of the year.

August was a hot month and we had several house fires, several car wrecks, and a lot of medical calls. Even though we had a lot of heat we were blessed with rain also that kept us in green grass, which in turn keeps the outside fires and brush fires down.

We have had a lot of different types of training going on and most of it being inside because of the heat, some of this included medical training when a football player gets injured since football is starting up. Also 3 minute drill in which you have to pull up and catch your hydrant, deploy your fire hose off the truck, and put the truck in pump gear and get water flowing from the hydrant to the truck and from the truck to the fire in less than 3 minutes, just to mention a few.

We did have one of our local businesses that sustained some damage after a fire this month. Razorback Muffler while putting on a muffler and caught a gas line on fire which quickly spread to the whole vehicle that was up on a rack. After getting the call we were there and extinguished the fire in minutes. There were only minor damage to the building and they were back in business in a few days.

The fire department is required to do flow test on our air pack every year and just completed these tests at the end of this month. All of the packs checked out in good shape after a few repairs to some of the packs.

- 2. Approval of Minutes: May 23, 2016 minutes were approved as written. The June 2016 meeting had been canceled.
- 3. Comments from Citizens: None.
- **4.A.** Public Hearing Variance Request Farmington Baptist Church Main Street Geoff Bates, engineer, was present and explained the planned basketball court, drainage and paving work.

Chairman Mann called for question to approve variance with understanding that Mr. Bates would again review the finalized plans with Melissa McCarville. Passed unanimously.

4. B. Public Hearing – Variance Request to Waive Large Scale Development Requirements - Ayers Drywall – Highway 62 West

Randy Ritchey was present for Ayers and explained the building was for supplies storage only. No one will work in the building except to load or unload supplies. They do not want to pave entire area but just concrete driveway to building and a concrete pad in back of building.

An adjoining residence would be built for the owner of the grooming facility who wishes to move her pet salon (Vanity Fur) from Main Street to this site. It would be near the veterinary office.

There were no comments from City Engineer Brackett, audience, or commissioners. Upon vote, rezoning request was unanimously approved.
