# MINUTES

### Minutes of the Regular Farmington City Council Meeting August 8, 2022

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday, August 8th, 2022, was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Council Members answered to their names: Sherry Mathews, Hunter Carnahan, Keith Lipford, Linda Bell, Brenda Cunningham, Bobby Morgan. Diane Bryant and Shelly Parsley. City Attorney Steve Tennant was present.

#### **Comments from Citizens**

Mayor Penn asked if there was anyone who wished to comment at this time. Marc Pulse, 12385 Richardson Road addressed the city council with concerns about excessive speeding on Richardson Road. He used several time samples, work times, shift changes and late night, and many times the speed was over 60 MPH. Hook Lane to Clubhouse Parkway dips and if you were pulling into a driveway, the speed could make it really close. He knew speed bumps had been objected due to the hazards for rescue vehicles. Could the rescue vehicles use a gps to detect the speed bumps or flashing lights to warn as they approached? There are new additions and traffic funnels thru there and speed is an issue. People are also having excess parking down the sidewalk, kids on electric scooters and skateboards have to walk around them. He would like to have speed bumps put in as well as the police department patrol the area.

### Approval of the minutes for the July 11, 2022, Regular Meeting.

On the motion of Council Member Bryant, a second by Council Member Parsley and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 8-0.

### Financial Reports.

Mayor Penn presented the financial reports to the City Council. City sales tax increased 25.2 % and State sales tax increased 19.4 %. Mayor Penn advised the council that the city would be moving \$2,000,000 (two million dollars) from the general fund into a one-year certificate of deposit earning 2.25 % interest with the First Community Bank of Batesville. The transfer is to be signed and authorized by Mayor Ernie Penn, City Clerk Kelly Penn and City Business Manager Melissa McCarville. City Clerk Penn informed the council that that if there were any projects that they would like to see budgeted for in the 2023 fiscal year that they should let her know or the Mayor and a list could be complied to be shared with the city council and schedule a work session, if needed, to go over when the budget is being prepared.

### Entertain a motion to read all Ordinances and Resolutions by title only.

On the motion of Council Member Cunningham and a second by Council Member Lipford and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to read all Ordinances and Resolutions by title only was approved 8-0.

# <u>Proclamations, Special Announcements, Committee/Commission Appointments. Committee Reports</u> Economic Development Grant for the Senior Center- Mayor Penn informed the council that the city had been awarded a \$200,000 (two hundred thousand dollars) grant for physical additions to the Farmington Senior Center.

Trails Grant – Mayor Penn advised the city had received the highest score awarded for consideration of the trails grant, this is just step one with several more to go, but the city is in good shape.

City of Fayetteville Water & Sewer Rates – Mayor Penn and City Attorney Tennant attended the city council meeting at Fayetteville with regards to the proposed increase of water and sewer rates to the residents of Farmington and surrounding towns. The city of Fayetteville tabled the item until their December 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. City Attorney Tennant and Mayor Penn will be negotiating the renewal of our water contract to reflect rates that are fair and equitable to our citizens, not a 39% increase as proposed by the Black & Veech Study.

HMRAC Tour – Mayor Penn and representatives for the HMRAC committee and Linus Medical meet on July 25<sup>th</sup> to tour 2 sites in Farmington for their business.

Chick-Fil-A – Mayor Penn has been in talks with a local Chick-fil-a franchise owner to add a location in Farmington. They are considering putting a food truck in Farmington.

Police Captain Wilbanks informed the city council that School Resource Officer Jimmy Brotherton had been awarded the School Resource Office of the Year in the State of Arkansas. Officer Brotherton was presented a plaque and Mayor Penn gave him a key to the city.

Parks & Recreation Committee -- Chairwoman Mathews advised the council the Farmington Heights HOA had been elected and she would be meeting with them to select the amenities to their neighborhood park. It's an acre lot and there will be no offsite parking.

# Ordinance No. 2022-14 An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 99.8.1 (D) §3 to modify the measuring criteria for lots in Cul-de-Sacs

Council Member Carnahan made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2022-14 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Cunningham and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Tennant read Ordinance 2022-14 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2022-14 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Carnahan and seconded by Council Member Mathews, after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

# <u>Award Bid to Sweetser Construction in the amount \$127,070 for construction of RCP drainage structures on</u> Goose Creek.

On the motion of Council Member Carnahan and a second by Council Member Cunningham and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to award the contract to Sweetser Construction in the amount of \$127,070.00 (One hundred twenty-seven thousand and seventy dollars) was approved 8-0.

### 2022 Additional Subsidy Funding Request from Central EMS in the amount of \$28,655.00.

On the motion of Council Member Bell and a second by Council Member Lipford and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to approve the additional 2022 subsidy to CEMS for \$28,655.00 (Twenty-eight thousand, six hundred and fifty-five dollars) was approved 8-0.

There being no further business to come before the council and on the motion of Council Member Morgan and seconded by Council Member Lipford and by the consent of all members present, the meeting adjourned at 6:50pm until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held Monday, September 12th, 2022 in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, located at 354 West Main Street, Farmington, Arkansas.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2022-15

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A TAX ON THE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS, FOR THE YEAR 2023 FIXING THE RATE THEREOF AT 5.0 MILS AND CERTIFYING THE SAME TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to collect taxes on both real and personal property in order to provide service to the citizens of the City of Farmington, and the State law of the City of Farmington is allowed to do so:

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS:

<u>Section 1:</u> That a tax is hereby levied on the real and personal property within the City of Farmington, Arkansas for the year 2023, to be collected in 2024, for the following purposes at the following rates:

### REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY

Purpose	Levy
General Fund	5.0 Mils

<u>Section 2</u>: That the real and personal property tax so levied and the rate provided therefore are hereby certified to the Clerk of Washington County, Arkansas, to be placed in the tax book by the County Clerk and collected in the same manner that the county and school district taxes are collected.

Section 3: That the City Clerk is authorized and directed to file certified copies of the Ordinance in the Office of the County Recorder, County Clerk, County Assessor and the County Tax Collector for Washington County, Arkansas.

<u>Section 4</u>: Repealing Clause. All other Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5: Severability Clause. In the event any portion of the Ordinance is declared inoperative or invalid as a result of a statue or judicial decision, then only that portion

expressly so declared to be inoperative or invalid shall be affected thereby and all other provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6: Emergency Clause. That the City Council of the City of Farmington, Arkansas, further determines that this Ordinance is necessary to adequately and properly protect the inhabitants of the City; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

- The kickball league is up and running. Call Laurie Adkins with questions.
- We have been awarded the TAP grant from NWARP. The grant is in the amount of \$500,000 and will go toward our trail project. We are waiting to hear about the State TAP grant. That award should be announced in November.
- There is a new line item in General Fund revenue titled Police Stipend, in the amount of \$96,885.00. We ran a payroll to pay the police officers their stipend and these funds were transferred into the Payroll account. The money covered \$5,000 stipend for 18 officers, plus the city portion of Social Security and Medicare.
- The new owners of the duplexes are amenable to our request for easements. We are finalizing the paper work.
- No word from legislative audit yet. I'll let you all know when they schedule our audit.
- With the help of Garver Engineering we are applying for Bridge Investment Program Planning, Bridge Projects, and Large Bridge Projects, Department of Transportation DOT, Federal Highway Administration. This grant will cover both large bridges on Double Springs and the culvert in between. This is federal money and is a complicated application process. \$10,000,000,000.00 in grant funding is possible; we are asking for 5,265,000.00; our match would be \$585,000.00.





# **Public Hearings:**

4A. Extension of Large Scale Development-Holland Crossing Mini Storage property located off N. Holland Dr. Parcel #760-03869-000, 760-03866-000, 760-03868-000 owned by Alberta Investments, LLC. Presented by Earthplan Design Alternatives, PA:

James Guertz with EDA was present to discuss the request. They are asking for an extension on the large scale development project. This is under contract by another company to purchase and take over the project. They are 30 days into the process. They are asking to do the mini storage in two phases due to caution since the economy is a bit unsettled right now. Originally, the full construction plans were developed and reviewed. At this time there has been no final permitting and no construction has occurred.

Chris Brackett submitted a memo as follows:

"The Large Scale Development Plan for the Holland Crossing Mini Storage was approved by this body on July 26, 2021. The developer has request an extension of this approval and this extension has been reviewed and it is my opinion that the Planning Commission's approval should be conditional on the following comments.

- 1. All connections to the water and sewer systems must be approved by the City of Fayetteville.
- 2. Approval from the Gas Company for improvements over the high- pressure gas line must be provided prior to construction approval. If this approval is denied, this project will be required to go back to the Planning Commission for approval of the revised plan.
- 3. A completed Grading Permit Application and fee must be submitted prior to final approval of the plans. A preconstruction conference will be required prior to any mass grading on the site. The owner, the engineering consultant, and their contractor responsible for the best management practices will be required to attend this conference.
- 4. After a final review set of plans and drainage report has been approved by KMS, the applicant should submit to the City two (2) sets of full size plans and three (3) sets of half size plans, and

two (2) copies of the final drainage report that have been sealed by the engineer of record for final approval and distribution."

Mr. Guertz had seen Mr. Brackett's memo and agreed to the conditions.

There is a concern with public and construction access between the two phases via Broadway Street. We do not want access to phase II until phase I is complete. There will be a fence around phase I to prevent such access. The drainage was a concern that will be addressed by the nearby detention pond. This was built to withstand all the neighboring properties and this development. This will flow into the creek.

Public comment: None

Having no further discussion, Robert Mann called the question to approve the extension of Large Scale Development subject to Chris Brackett's memo and the additional condition that there will be no construction traffic on Broadway Street, a residential area; construction traffic must use Holland Avenue. Upon roll call, the motion passed unanimously.

It was noted that review of Multi-Family Design Standards will continue at the September work session.






