MINUTES OF THE REGULAR FARMINGTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 12, 2023

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday, June 12, 2023 was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Council Members answered to their names: Diane Bryant, Keith Lipford, Brenda Cunningham, Sherry Mathews, Hunter Carnahan, Linda Bell, Bobby Morgan, and Kara Gardenhire. Also present were City Attorney Jay Moore and City Business Manager McCarville. Mayor Penn led the pledge of allegiance.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS

Phyllis Young, 546 Goose Creek Road – advised the city council the drainage flow and velocity had increased on her property, it floods all the time and rocks and trash are all over her land. She is concerned that hay haulers are no longer able to use her property and have to get out on Goose Creek Road and that is a safety hazard. She had a gate constructed and it has debris washed up against it and it's about to fall over. She is concerned with the planning commission approving a cul de sac in Goose Creek Village and now it is greenspace and a road. People can't buy lots and the engineers, Chris Brackett and Jorgenson & Associates, planned to put a road there all along and that's false advertising and does the city want that type of reputation?

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FOR THE JUNE 13, 2022 REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

City Clerk Penn advised the council that during the current review by Legislative Audit there was an agenda item left off the approved minutes of the June 13, 2022 meeting. It was a clerical error that the item was not attached to the approved minutes. The auditors and city business manager McCarville reviewed the recording of the meeting, and it was determined the council did approve the item and Legislative Audit recommended the minutes be amended to reflect it. On the motion of Council Member Carnahan and a second by Council Member Bryant and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the amended minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 8-0.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mayor Penn presented the financial reports to the City Council. Monthly city sales tax increased 3.8%. Year to date, our total sales tax is up 4.04% versus 2022 sales tax numbers. Monthly state/county sales tax increased 6.68%. Year to date, our total sales tax is up 9.35% versus 2022 sales tax numbers.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-09 AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT A REVISED PERSONNEL POLICY FOR THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS.

City Business Manager McCarville informed the council that the auditors from Legislative Audit had requested the city update the overtime policy to agree with the Fair Labor Standards Act. Our policy indicated we would pay overtime for hours worked over 8 hours in a day versus the new policy that will require overtime for hours worked over 40 hours in a week. There is also language added to address overtime pay for 24-hour shift firefighters. There is no budget impact, and the city will not be cited for any deficiencies with this in place. Mayor Penn asked for public comment, there was none. Council Member Cunningham made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-09 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Lipford and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-09 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-09 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Lipford and after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-10 AN ORDINANCE REZONING PROPERTY AT 102 CYNTHIA AVENUE FROM R-1, SINGLE FAMILY RESIDIENTIAL, TO R-O, RESIDENTIAL OFFICE AS REQUESTED BY MELTON NALL.

Council Member Carnahan made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-10 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Bryant and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-10 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-10 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Morgan and after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-11 AN ORDINANCE WAIVING REQUIREMENTS OF COMPETITIVE BIDDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF A NEW BRUSH TRUCK FROM BANNER FIRE EQUIPMENT FOR THE FARMINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO A.C.A. §14-58-303 (b) 2 (B)

Fire Chief Hellard informed the council that there were no trucks available in the approved state bid and that inventories were low, making it difficult to secure a vehicle. He requested the council approval to accept the bid from Banner Fire Equipment to purchase a 2023 Dodge 3500 Brush Truck, with funds allocated up to \$95,000.00. Mayor Penn asked for public comment, there was none. After council discussion Council Member Lipford made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-11 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Mathews and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-11 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion to approve Ordinance 2023-11 passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-11 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Lipford and after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

City Attorney Moore left the meeting at 6:37 pm.

Mayor Penn asked for public comment, there was none. After council discussion, a motion was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Lipford and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to approve the updated verbiage for the Behavior Expectations sign was approved 8-0.
